
lake michigan scenic coastal tour

Begin your Lake Michigan Scenic Coastal Tour in the heart of Downtown Manistee. Here you can explore the Big Manistee River Channel along the 2-mile Manistee Riverwalk - where there are 18 historic markers that explain much of the natural and industrial history that took place along this coastline along with the Origins Walk at First Street Beach.

Orchard Beach State Park 🏌 🧰 GPS: 44.283791, -86.313410

Found along M-110 (Lakeshore Drive) on your way towards M-22, you will come across Orchard Beach State Park. It's home to a great seasonal state park (very popular with camping enthusiasts) and a beginner level trail system.

2 Lake Bluff Bird Sanctuary 🖒 🗿 GPS: 44.290736, -86.309736

This 76-acre wildlife sanctuary is home to 178 bird species and is one of the most popular northern Michigan destinations for birdwatching on this 5-acre arboretum. Here you will find 2 Michigan champion trees, along with the only sequoia in Michigan. You can also gain access to the Lake Michigan shoreline.

3 Glen Park Mineral Springs 🕅 💿 GPS: 44.368751, -86.209142

Pioneer residents of Onekama were active in the development of the Glen, where the first bona fide resort in Manistee County rose and fell during the late 1800s. The springs on the property had "rare combinations of the North Pierhead Lighthouse curative and healthgiving properties," as found in testing. Today, the springs are Manistee frequently visited by locals and tourists

Manistee County has two popular artesian wells which have been enjoyed by locals and visitors for many years. This is the first of two wells and is popular amongst the local residents. These water sources are considered to produce some of the purest water in the county.



Along Portage Point Drive, west of Downtown Onekama, you will come across the Portage Point Resort. Constructed in 1903, it was built as a premier resort destination for all, and today, it is still living up to its cause. At the end of Portage Point Drive you will find one of the region's top Lake Michigan beach access points where the mouth of Portage Point Lake meets the big lake.



The awe-inspiring beauty of a Great Lakes Coastal Marsh is yours to enjoy as you walk, hike, canoe or kayak through the 155-acre Arcadia Marsh Nature Preserve. Located just south of the Village of Arcadia on the east side of M-22, it is one of only 15 or so remaining Great Lakes Coastal Marshes along the shoreline of Lake Michigan's Lower Peninsula and is

owned, protected and managed by the Grand Traverse Regional Land Conservancy.

It's also a great birding site, hosting over 150 bird species and is a year-round habitat for many fish and aquatic organisms.





As you are driving north through Manistee County on the beautiful scenic highway M-22, you will find yourself "on top of the county" when you reach the Arcadia Overlook (known as "Inspiration Point"). The view doesn't stop here-put on your walking shoes and travel up the 120 steps (80 vertical feet) to the top lookout and gaze out on one of the most picturesque views that truly define Manistee County as "Pure Michigan".

8 Old Baldy Trails / 🗀 GPS: 44.535531, -86.225751

Enjoy this beautiful trail system as it looks out onto Lake Michigan. The hike begins in the dense hardwoods and ends out on the beautiful dune bluffs of Lake Michigan. This is a great place for an afternoon picnic or a run with the family pet! This is also a great spot to enjoy trail riding.

9 Explore Elberta © GPS: 44.619312, -86.223873

When you are nearly 10 minutes from Frankfort, you will drive through a chute of trees and see Elberta and Frankfort in the distance, flanked by the aqua water of Lake Michigan.

music on the patio.


Walk around Downtown Frankfort © GPS: 44.632181, -86.239510

When you make your way around Betsie Lake, you will turn left down Main Street through the heart of the downtown, where there are great opportunities to grab lunch, take in some shopping and see the historic Frankfort lighthouse at the waterfront park. If you have time, be sure to drive down Forest and Leelanau Avenues and enjoy the abundance of restored Victorian homes that adorn these streets. Many are painted in vibrant colors with lush landscaping and wrap-around porches.

(12) (13) (14) Sleeping Bear Sand Dunes Hiking Trails 🕅

Miles of sandy beaches, bluffs that tower 450' above Lake Michigan, lush forests and crystal clear inland lakes await you on this stretch of your M-22 Scenic Coastal Tour! If you feel like stretching your legs, feel free to get out and enjoy the hiking trails of Old Indian Trail (12), Platte Plains (13) or the Empire Bluff Trail (14). All explore the deep hardwoods of the National Lakeshore ending on the shores of Lake Michigan on the rolling sands of the dunes. Each trail hike can take 1.0-1.5 hours.

15) Explore Empire

Quaint shops, small cafes and outdoor activities are contained within and surround the Village of Empire! Be sure to stop at the Empire Area Museum and their 6 historic buildings showcasing turn-of-the-century 1900s life in the area.


16) Pierce Stocking Scenic Drive 🛅 GPS: 44.857293, -86.065162

Find yourself high atop the Lake Michigan shoreline and explore the National Lakeshore's Scenic Drive. This 7.4 mile drive loops you through the forest and along the coastline. A national park vehicle pass is required for trail and scenic drive use.

The Dune Climb 🕅 🔯 GPS: 44.882174, -86.041462

As you leave the scenic drive, a few miles north you will come across the Dune Climb. This is again a great spot to stop and enjoy the scenery and clear waters of Glen Lake in the distance. The Dune Climb is a great spot to snap a photo of the entire family.





18 Glen Haven 🏛 🏌 GPS: 44.903575, -86.027245

Here you can visit the Sleeping Bear Point Coast Guard Station Maritime Museum as well as many beautifully restored century-old buildings. Next to the Museum you will also find a trail (The Dunes Trail) which gives you another opportunity to hike the Lakeshore.

19 Glen Arbor

As you arrive in Glen Arbor, you will find yourself in a bustling little village that thrives throughout the year. Rent bikes, scooters, or just walk around the village and visit destination places like the M-22 shop, Cherry Republic and much more! Also take in the few wine tasting stops in the heart of this quaint coastal community.

20 Pyramid Point *\(\) \(\) GPS: 44.967026, -85.924019

Just off of Port Oneida Road, take the walking path through the hardwoods and pop out high atop the bluff with pictuesque

views of the Manitou Islands and Good Harbor Bay. A must stop if you have the time and want to experience a superb Lake Michigan sunset. Keep in mind, if you do stop, it takes about 90 minutes to go out and back and will delay your arrival to Leland. Some shops will be closed before you arrive if it is later in the afternoon.

21 Leland & Historic Fishtown GPS: 45.022917, -85.760110

Once you arrive in Leland, you will find excellent shopping, dining and local attractions as well as Historic Fishtown. Fishtown celebrates Northern Michigan's commercial fishing heritage and is alive and well in this small community. Fishtown is one of the last remaining commercial fishing villages in the State of Michigan and is now integrated with clothing boutiques, art galleries and specialty food shops.

🕴 Foodie Stop

Waterfront dining in the heart of Fishtown specializing in serving fresh Lake Michigan whitefish, prime cuts and their famous seafood chowder. Known for the signature cocktail, "The Chubby Mary."

Foodie & Market Stop



After taking in a few wine stops following your visit to the Grand Traverse Light and Leelanu State Park, you will come across Suttons Bay. A great coastal community with shopping, galleries and unique dining stops, this is a must stop after a day of exploring M-22.
